Community

Spanning 182 square miles, Sherrard School District serves the educational needs of Rock Island and Mercer Counties in the northwestern part of Illinois. Currently, the district consists of five schools, two elementary schools, one middle school, and a combined junior high and high school. The student body population is made up of 89% White, 6% Hispanic, 3% two or more races, 1% Asian, and 1% Black.

School

Sherrard High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 454 students in grades 9–12. The school opened in the fall of 1978 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 1979. Sherrard High School is accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and holds membership in the College Board and the National Association for College Admission Counseling.

Curriculum

Students graduating in the class of 2023 at Sherrard High School need a minimum of 25 credits for graduation. Students graduating in the class of 2024 and beyond need a minimum of 26 credits for graduation. English (4 credits), Science (2 credits, **3 credits for Class of 2024 and beyond**), Math (3 credits), Social Studies (3 credits), Computers (1 credit), Consumer Education (.5 credit), Health (.5 credit), PE (4 credits), Drivers Education (1 credit), Music, Art, Foreign Language, or Vocational Elective (1 credit), general Electives (5 credits), and must complete ten (10) hours of volunteerism.

Sherrard High School offers several AP® courses: Biology, Calculus AB, Chemistry, Computer Science A, 2-D Art and Design, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Physics, Statistics and United States History.

Honors classes are offered in English I, English II, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Biology, Biology II, and Chemistry.

Rank

Sherrard High School does not rank. Students will be recognized by the Latin system of Summa Cum Laude for GPA of 4.3, Magna Cum Laude for GPA of 4.2, and Cum Laude for GPA of 4.0





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Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is computed using the above quality points, which are cumulative from the end of the first semester of their freshman year. A minimum of 25 credits are required for graduation for the classes 2022, and 2023. A minimum of 26 credits are required for graduation for the class of 2024 and beyond. AP and Honors classes are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and June.
