Please remember that vacations that are scheduled during the school year are, by state code, unexcused absences. We encourage all families to plan trips during non-school days. If there are extenuating circumstances in which you need to have your student miss for these types of events, please contact me at wernentint@sherrard.us to discuss the absence.

As we near the end of the quarter, a reminder about our grading system; semester grades are calculated based on work from the entire semester and the final exam. We no longer use the average of the two quarter grades plus the final. The quarter grade is now a progress update, similar to our midterm grade checks. Also, remember the 70-30 breakdown of grade weights in which summative assessments (tests, quizzes, projects, major labs, etc.) account for 70% of the student's grade, while the remaining activities (homework, participation, daily work, etc.) account for 30% of the student's grade. The 70-30 scale is utilized in core classes and most elective classes. The grading scale applies to both in-person and remote learners. Please contact your student's teacher if you have questions.

Our hope, like yours, is that we are able to return to a "normal" school experience for all students as soon as possible. Until then, your support in continuing following the required COVID protocols is greatly appreciated.

Parents and Guardians,

Thank you for all your help with In-person and Remote Learners. Making sure the students have their own supplies and face coverings has been essential for in-person learning. Cueing students to join remotely is also important for virtual student's success. Finally checking the Infinite Campus portal to see how your child is progressing is the most important way to check your child's academics.

Another way to check your child's progress is to sign up for Parent-Teacher Conferences on Oct 7 and 8th.

For P/T conferences, typically we have an early release schedule that shortens all the periods of the day. This year, due to the block schedule, we are simply removing the last period - 7th and 8th periods - of both days (and a few minutes out of 5th and 6th periods) so classes will only be scheduled for students up until 1:00 pm dismissal. Conferences (this year virtually or by phone) will start at 2:10 pm and run until 6:30 pm.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION:

Did you know that you can receive daily or weekly notifications from your student's Google Classrooms? As a guardian, you can get email summaries about your student's activity in Classroom. Email summaries do not include grades.

In email summaries, you can review:

- Missing work—Work not turned in when the summary was sent.
- Upcoming work—Work that's due today and tomorrow (for daily emails) or that's due in the upcoming week (for weekly emails).
- Class activities—Announcements, assignments, and questions recently posted by teachers.

To get email summaries of your student's work, you must accept an email invitation from a teacher. You can unsubscribe from summaries or remove yourself as a guardian at any time.

Steps to receive notification:

1. The teacher emails you an invitation to join your student's class.
2. In your email program, open your email invitation and accept.

In addition, the parent portal on Infinite Campus is a great tool to monitor grades and assignments. If you do not have a parent portal, or cannot gain access to yours, please contact Jen Thurman to get it set up at thurmanj@sherrard.us.

With a mix of students in school and at home, we feel it is important to expand our reach to students that may be struggling. Every week students complete an online emotional check-in form. The emotional check-in is a safe place for students to share their emotions and a quick way for the counseling staff to assess mental health needs. After completing the emotional check-in, the counseling staff will complete individual check-ins with students that were in the struggling categories. For remote learners, the counseling staff will offer a zoom meeting or phone call to discuss their feelings.

Jesse Hamerlinck from the Mercer County Mental Health Action Program is also providing support services to students and families through case management. She is located in the HS counseling office on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. The Mental Health Action Program works to address students' social emotional wellness, provide resources and referrals for mental health and wellness services, and eliminate barriers to care. The action program may also assist with other social determinants of health such as food insecurity, housing, and financial issues. NINTH GRADE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS for SCHOOL YEAR 20-21

- All ninth grade students are required to have an updated school physical.
- State law requires Illinois Department of Public Health form to be used.
- Physical forms are available at the school and on the school district web site www.sherrard.us, go to Departments and select Health Services, Health Forms and Student Physical Form.
- Physicals must be completed and signed by a physician licensed to practice medicine, a physician's assistant, or an advanced practice nurse. Chiropractors MAY NOT perform school or sports physicals.
- Parents or guardians are required by state law to complete and sign the health history portion on the back of the physical form.
- Sports physicals will not fulfill this requirement. The ninth grade physical may be used for a sport physical for 395 days from the date of the exam. Students who receive freshman physicals March 1, 2020 will need another sports physical by April 1 of 2021, if they desire to participate in spring sports. Please keep this in mind when scheduling your child's physical.
- Call for vaccine and physical appointments prior to end of this school year.
- A copy of your child's immunization record may be required by the health care provider.
- **STUDENTS NOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH PHYSICAL AND IMMUNIZATIONS WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL PER STATE REQUIREMENTS.**
- **NEW REQUIREMENT:** All 9th grade students must have a current dental exam dated after 11/15/19 or waiver completed by May 15, 2021. Forms are available on the district web site under Health Forms.

*****NOTE: See below from ISBE regarding physical and immunizations. All required physicals and immunizations are to be completed by October 15, 2020. Student not in compliance will not be able to attend school after this date until requirements are met.**



IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT FOR TWELFTH GRADE

All students entering the **12th grade** shall show proof of having received two doses of the **meningitis vaccine** prior to entering the **12th grade**. The first dose shall have been received on or after the **11h birthday**, and the second dose shall have been administered on or after the **16th birthday**, and at least eight weeks after the first dose. If the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older, only one dose is required.

*****NOTE: See below from ISBE regarding immunizations. All required immunizations are to be completed by October 15, 2020. Student not in compliance will not be able to attend school after this date until requirements are met.**

From ISBE: Illinois State Board of Education

The COVID-19 pandemic has presented many challenges to routine medical care, causing many children to fall behind on scheduled immunizations. In order to protect individuals and communities from vaccine-preventable diseases and to prepare for the return to school, medical providers are urging parents to make appointments to resume necessary immunizations. At this time, all child-health related requirements for school attendance, remain in effect for children in public, private, or parochial schools, as per 105 ILCS 5/27-8.1.

Health-related examinations and immunization requirements are due no later than October 15 or an earlier specified date as determined by the district (to include a required 60 days prior notice). There is no language in the Code that differentiates on-site/physical learning vs. remote/distance learning. Districts should adhere to the current requirements as per 105 ILCS 5/27-8.1, and all students enrolled in school should show proof of appropriate grade-level requirements. Required physicals must be completed on the Certificate of Child Health Exam Form (completed in its entirety with required signatures). This form is acceptable to meet the requirements for a sports physical, but an IESA/IHSA sports physical form may not be used to fulfill the child health examination. <http://www.dph.illinois.gov/sites/default/files/forms/certificate-of-child-health-examination-03032017.pdf>

<h2>Begin and end each day with a check-in</h2>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make sure to log in EVERY DAY and check in with each class. • Check <u>your</u> email EVERY DAY for Google Classroom notifications (you can select daily or weekly updates). If you find that you need more information about assignment details and are not signed up for Google Classroom notifications, please contact your teachers. • Keep your email open all day in case an important email comes through.
<h2>Routines and Expectations for Learning at Home</h2>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a realistic schedule for getting work done in defined periods, building in breaks and times for socializing, exercising and entertainment. <i>The key principle:</i> do a session of work first, then reward yourself with something relaxing. • Remember that <u>COMMUNICATION</u> is very important! <u>You</u> should be checking in regularly with your teachers. A simple email will go a long way! • If you are struggling, email your teacher for assistance. • Maintain regular sleep routines and wake times. • Find a designated space to work away from any distractions such as video games, tv, music, etc. • Advocate for yourself if you need assistance. If your efforts are not successful, email Mr. Newquist, Mrs. Drish, or Mrs. Blackwell for assistance (see contact info below). • Keep up to date with your grades by using the student portal on Infinite Campus.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARADE PARTICIPANTS

1. Each float should not exceed \$150.00 in construction costs. The name of the organization or class must be clearly marked on both sides of the float.
2. The theme for this year's parade is High School Musical, "We're All In This Together". Sherrard's opponent is Princeton. Their mascot is the Tigers and their colors are blue and silver.
3. Floats are preferable for the parade, but you may enter a decorated car or truck or a walking ensemble.
4. Float riders must be approved on an individual basis determined by float design and number of riders.
5. Vehicles pulling floats should be driven by licensed drivers who have proof of insurance in their vehicle.
6. Float decorating cannot be done during school hours and should be stopped by 10:00 p.m. Float construction may begin Sunday, January 10, 2021. A class sponsor or other responsible adult must be present at each decorating session.
7. The parade will start from THE OLD HIGH SCHOOL at **10:00 a.m. Saturday, January 16, 2021.** The parade will assemble in the **GRASS FIELD AT THE OLD HIGH SCHOOL at 8:00 a.m. sharp.** The parade will end at the south end of the old school.
8. No items, including candy and gum, may be **thrown or handed out** during the parade due to COVID-19 guidelines.
9. After the parade, floats should be returned to where they were constructed for the purpose of dismantling.
10. Immediately following the parade, the float winners will be announced as well as the class winners of homecoming week.
